

2020 Session Overview

The 2020 Legislative Session adjourned “sine die” on March 19, at 1:49 p.m. as the state and nation started to face and prepare for the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19. Of the approximately 3,500 filed bills, only 207 passed both chambers. Given the current pandemic, Governor Ron DeSantis has only signed sixteen bills into law. The 2020 state budget which topped out at \$93.2 billion and outlines the state’s spending plan in the areas of education, criminal justice, environment, transportation, and health care, has yet to be signed.

Some highlights of this year’s budget include:

- \$300 million for COVID-19 response
- 3% Pay Increase for All State Employees
- \$500 million for teacher pay increase
- \$125 million in funding for Florida Forever
- \$387 million for Affordable Housing

Other major issues passing this year:

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Funding

The legislature has committed to set aside \$300 million in funding to respond to the coronavirus outbreak. The money will be committed to help fund increased testing as well as helping to offset the cost of the weak economy. The legislature is hoping to ensure the funding will be enough for the near future. The state is also taking actions to fight COVID-19 by working with the private sector as well as the federal government.

Advanced Practice Registered Nurses | CS/CS/HB 607 by Rep. Carey Pigman (R-Sebring)

A priority of House Speaker Jose Oliva, HB 607 allows advanced registered nurse practitioners (APRN) that meet a specific criterion to practice advanced or specialized nursing and allows physician assistants (PAs) to practice primary care without physician supervision. An advisory committee, which would include physicians and APRNs, would create a list of medical acts that autonomously practicing APRNs may conduct. Furthermore, these APRNs and PAs may serve as a patient's primary care provider.

Effective Date 7/1/2020

Teacher Pay Increase | HB 641 by Rep. Rene Plasencia (R-Titusville) & Rep. Toby Overdorf (R-Stuart)

This session lawmakers delivered on the Governor's promise to increase teacher salaries by allocating \$500 million in the budget for salary increases. An amendment to HB 641 regarding Articulated Acceleration Mechanisms in Education, states that each school district would get money based proportionately on their share of the Florida Education Finance Program. Around 100,000 teachers are set to receive raises, as the proposal increases the base salary for classroom and pre-kindergarten teachers to \$47,500. The bill also states that school districts can provide raises for personnel and teachers who are above the base salary or who received less than a two percent increase.

Effective Date 7/1/2020

iBudget Redesign | SB 82 by Sen. Aaron Bean (R-Fernandina Beach)

This Session lawmakers a bill designed to make cost-effective operational changes to the Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services Waiver or iBudget as the program has run on a deficit in past years. The bill redefines the definition of waiver support coordinators and eliminates independent contracting. Additionally, the bill centralizes medical necessity determinations related to significant needs requests by the Agency for Persons with Disabilities. The bill also includes an exemption to the certificate of needs process for intermediate care facilities for the developmentally disabled, with a sunset provision of July 1, 2022.

Effective Date 7/1/2020

Vacation Rentals | HB 1011 by Jason Fischer (R-Jacksonville)

Legislation that would preempt local governments from regulating vacation rentals once again failed to pass. The bill, which was opposed by cities across the state, would have let local governments regulate vacation rental activities only if the regulation would apply uniformly to all residential properties and would have preempted to the state the regulation of advertising platforms. The measure is expected to be addressed again in the next legislative session.

Failed to pass

College Athlete Pay | SB 646 by Debbie Mayfield (R-Melbourne)

With support from the Governor, legislators passed legislation that would allow in intercollegiate athlete to earn compensation for the use of their name, image or likeness. The bill also prohibits a postsecondary institution from restricting an athlete from obtaining professional representation by an agent or attorney. Additional provisions include disclosure of the contract as well as a mandatory financial literacy workshop that includes information about debt management, budgeting, time management and available academic resources.

Effective Date 7/1/2020

State Technology Overhaul | HB 1391 by Jamie Grant (R-Tampa)

The bill abolished the Division of State Technology and replaced it with the Florida Digital Service and created the Division of Telecommunications. The legislation tasks the Florida Digital Service to develop and implement standards for data interoperability across state government as well as the enforcement of the state's cloud-first procurement policy. Among other provision, the bill also creates a financial technology sandbox within the Office of Financial Regulation which will make innovative financial products or technology available to consumers.

Effective Date 7/1/2020

Constitutional Amendments | SB 1794 by Sen. Travis Hutson (R-Palm Coast)

In an effort to change the process for amending state constitution, SB 1794 modifies the scope of the citizen initiative amendment procedure. The bill expands the facial validity scope at which the Florida Supreme Court operate and narrows the role of the Financial Impact Estimating Conference (FIEC) to estimating the proposal's financial impact on state and local governments and the state budget. The bill also increases the geographic diversity and number of petition signatures that must be verified before the Secretary of State refers the proposal to the Attorney General and the FIEC.

Effective upon becoming law

Budget Issues of Interest Approved During the Session

Law Enforcement Training and Certification Services were funded at \$6,078,725, compared to last fiscal year's \$6,509,631.

Substantive Issues of Interest During Session

PASSED: First Responders and Correctional Officers – [HB 573](#) by Rep. Joseph Casello (D-Boynton Beach) & Rep. Stan McClain (R – Ocala)

If approved by the Governor, except as otherwise provided in the bill, takes effect on July 1, 2020.

HB 573 passed both chambers unanimously and await the Governor's signature. The bill defines a peer support communication as oral, electronic, or written communications between a first responder and a first responder peer. The communication must be made with a mutual expectation of confidentiality and for the purpose of discussing physical or emotional issues associated with the first responder's employment.

Under the bill, a first responder peer is a first responder who is not a health care practitioner, who has experience providing physical or emotional support to first responders, and who has been designated by the first responder's employing agency to provide peer support and has received training to do so. The bill generally prohibits the disclosure of a first responder's peer support communication with a first responder.

The bill protects the confidentiality of the communications by prohibiting the first responder peer from divulging the communications or from testifying in civil, criminal, administrative, and disciplinary proceedings regarding the communications, subject to the following exceptions:

- The first responder peer is a defendant in a civil, criminal, administrative, or disciplinary proceeding arising from a complaint filed by the first responder who was a party to the peer support communication;
- The first responder provides written consent;
- The person providing peer support suspects that the first responder has committed, or intends to commit, a criminal act or has reason to believe that the first responder is a threat to himself or herself or others; or

- There is a reasonable basis to fear for the safety of the first responder, another person, or society, and the first responder peer communicates relevant information only to a potential victim and law enforcement or other appropriate authorities.

The bill contains language which was originally proposed in SB 884 regarding Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers by Sen. Ed Hooper (R - Palm Harbor). The bill modifies the process for conducting law enforcement officer internal affairs investigations. Specifically, an agency head may request a sworn or certified investigator from a different agency to conduct the investigation when the employing agency identifies a conflict; the agency does not have an investigator trained to conduct such investigations; or the agency's investigator is the subject of or witness to an investigation and the agency is comprised of 35 or fewer officers. The employing agency must document the conflict, and upon completion of the investigation, the investigator must present the findings without a disciplinary recommendation to the employing agency.

The bill does not limit the disclosure of information obtained by a first responder peer from a source other than a peer.

PASSED: Drones— [HB 659](#) by Rep. Jason Fischer (R - Jacksonville)

If approved by the Governor, except as otherwise provided in the bill, takes effect on July 1, 2020.

HB 659 passed both chambers unanimously and awaits the Governor's signature. The bill creates an additional exception from the prohibition in existing law against law enforcement agencies using drones to gather evidence or information. The bill authorizes the use of drones by a non-law enforcement employee of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission or of the Florida Forest Service for the purposes of managing and eradicating invasive exotic plants or animals on public lands and suppressing or mitigating wildfire threats.

PASSED: Law Enforcement Vehicles – [SB 476](#) by Sen. Ed Hooper (R - Palm Harbor)

These provisions were approved by the Governor and take effect upon becoming law.

SB 476 passed both chambers unanimously and was approved by the governor on February 21. The bill (Chapter 2020-5, L.O.F.) provides that condominium, cooperative, and homeowners' associations may not prohibit a law enforcement officer who is a unit or parcel owner, or the tenant, guests or invitee of an owner, to park his or her assigned law enforcement vehicle in an area where the owner, or the tenant, guest, or invitee of an owner, has a right to park.

PASSED: Exposure of Sexual Organs– [HB 675](#) by Rep. Amy Mercado (D – Orlando)
If approved by the Governor, these provisions take effect October 1, 2020.

HB 675 increases the penalty from a first-degree misdemeanor to a third-degree felony for a second or subsequent offense of the unlawful exposure of sexual organs. The bill also specifies that being naked in public in a vulgar or indecent manner is a violation of s. 800.03, F.S. The bill provides that exposing of sexual organs by a mother breastfeeding her baby, or a person who is merely naked at a place provided or set apart for that purpose is not a violation of s. 800.03, F.S.

FAILED: Criminal Justice– [SB 346](#) by Sen. Rob Bradley (R- Orange Park)
The bill passed the Senate but died after it was Temporarily Postponed on Second Reading in the House.

SB 346 would have prohibited a person who purchases, or possesses less than 2 grams of a controlled substance, other than fentanyl, from being imprisoned for a term longer than 12 months. The bill would have allowed a court to depart from mandatory minimum sentences for drug trafficking offenses carrying mandatory minimum sentences of less than 25 years if the court found certain circumstances exist. The court would have been required to make the following findings on the record: the defendant has no prior conviction for a forcible felony; did not use violence or credible threats of violence, or possess a firearm or other dangerous weapon; the offense did not result in the death of or serious bodily injury to any person; the defendant was not an organizer and was not engaged in a continuing criminal enterprise; the defendant has truthfully provided all information and evidence in their possession concerning the offense or offenses that were part of the same course of conduct; and the defendant has not previously benefited from the application of this departure provision. Finally, the bill would have created a statutory requirement, and exceptions to that requirement, that a law enforcement officer conducting a custodial interrogation must electronically record the interrogation in its entirety.
